St Jude's is at the start of this important journey and we welcome any parent, carer or member of the community to join.

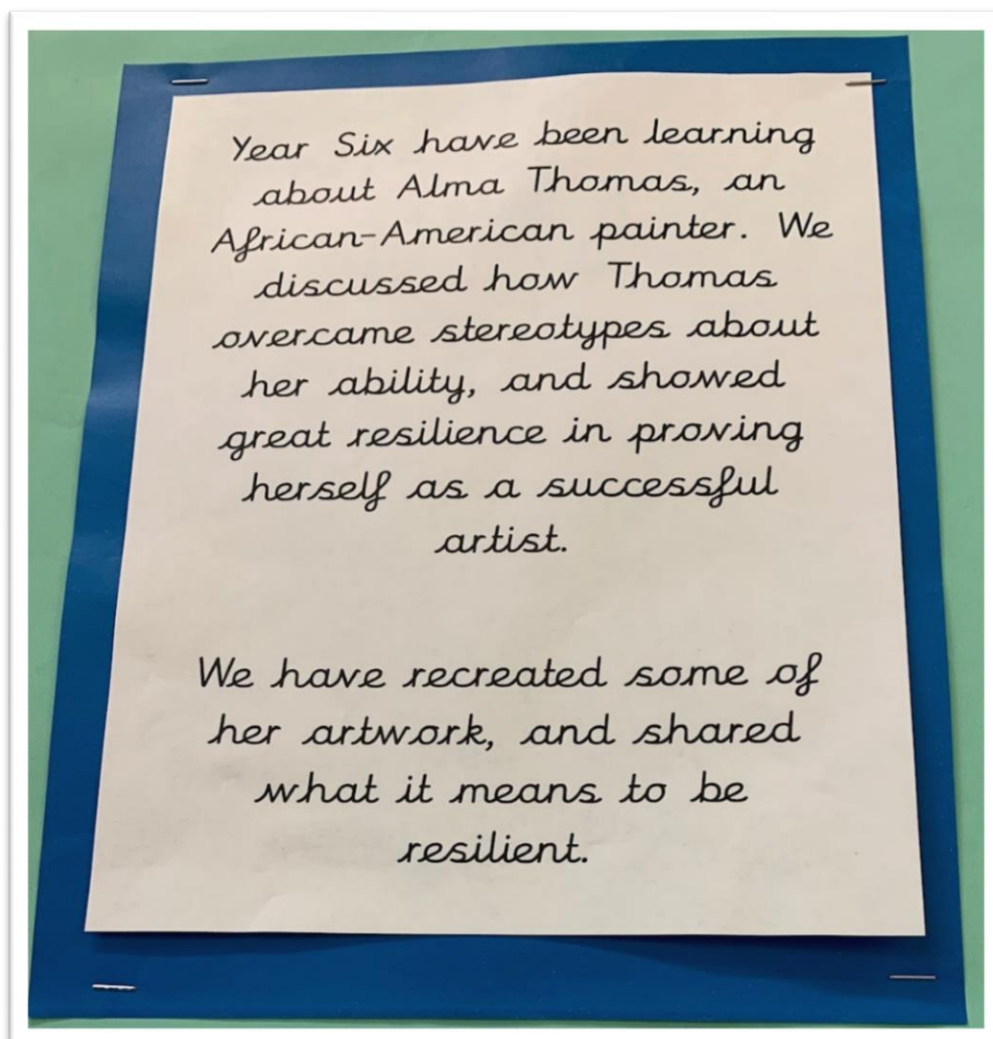
