- Reading a range of biographies and exploring their key features.
- Considering how planning our writing can support us and thinking about different ways of planning.
- Showing awareness of audience and purpose by adapting writing to more formal style.
- Look at using adverbials of time in our writing to create cohesion within and across paragraphs.
- Use modal verbs in our work.
- Recognise and use a range of clauses in our writing.

Personal, Health, Social and Citizenship:

Our unit of work this half term is called 'celebrating difference'.
In this unit of work we will be examining differences, what makes us all unique and special and discussing reasons why people of different backgrounds sometimes come in to conflict. We will also be celebrating difference across the world.

Science: Earth and Space:

- Learn the size and shape of the Earth, Moon and Sun.
- Explore how shadows change and why we have day and night.
- Learn how to describe the movement of the Earth and other planets, relative to the Sun.
- Describe the movement of the Moon relative to the Earth.

Music:

This half term, we will continue to practice writing notation and to create our own music through use of body percussion. We will continue with steel pans and will be listening to and analysing 'The Planets' by Gustav Holst.

Computing:

The internet

We will be learning how the internet operates, how to effectively retrieve information using a range of search engines and to understand what to do if something troubles us online.

Outdoor learning:

This half term we will be participating in an outdoor learning project. We will be renovating the nature garden and learning about plants and how to care for them in the process.

Art & Design:

We will investigate different techniques for sculpting using clay and tools. We will plan and then create our own model of the solar system using clay and paint.

Cooking:

We will be making rocket fruit kebabs.

Humanities:

- We will be developing our understanding of chronology through learning about key events.
- Presenting our findings in different ways.
- Making comparisons between aspects of history and the present day.
- Understanding that the type of information available depends on the period of history studied.
- Evaluate the usefulness of a variety of sources.
- Identify the physical characteristics and key topographical features of the countries within North America.

Maths:

Multiplication and Division:-

- We will be learning about multiples and factors, including common multiples and factors of numbers.
- We will be learning about squared and cubed numbers.
- We will be multiplying and dividing by multiples of 10.

Perimeter and Area

- We will be working out the perimeter of different shapes using a range of strategies.
- We will be calculating the area and the perimeter of compound shapes.

RE:

In RE, our key question is 'Do fame and Christian faith go together?'

We will be learning:

- The values needed to be Christian.
- To ask if and how Christian faith supports famous people in who they are
- To distinguish between qualities that make a famous person famous and qualities needed to be a Christian.

PE:

This half term we will be focussing on team sports, and in particular, Rugby.
