
### **Car idling in Herne Place**




## Maths

Year 4 have loved working with fractions and decimals practically this week. We used counters and tens frames to represent tenths and then used this representation to help us write it as a decimal. We had lots of discussions about the representation we thought was the clearest and had many different ideas:

Evelyn "I think the counters and tens frame is the clearest representation because you can see how many it has been split into and how many counters there are and how many gaps there are."

Robin "I think the number line is the clearest because you can jump along each interval and count up in fractions to work out the fraction."



## Art

In art, we have been looking at sculptures and designing our own. We looked at the mythical creatures on the front of Viking long ships to inspire our own designs. We explored scoring and gauging technique to attach pieces together. We then came up with some top tips to ensure pieces stay together when dried and stay standing.

## Childcare funding options

### Are you missing out on free childcare?

Some families with two-year-olds and all families with three and four-year-olds can claim up to 15 hours a week of free registered childcare. Many working parents of three and four-year olds can claim up to 30 hours of free childcare each week.

Early learning with a registered childcare provider can help your child develop important language, physical and social skills during the years when their brain is developing the fastest. Your child will also have the opportunity to make friends, learn new skills and grow in confidence before they start school.

To receive funding for this Summer term, you'll need to make sure you apply by Wednesday 31 March.
