Year 6's Learning this Week

Year six have been doing lots of exciting learning this week. In art, we have been creating our own Migration Series, based on the Migration Series by Jacob Lawrence. The children designed and painted their own series of sketches that they believed best represent migration.



In maths, we have been learning all about shapes! We used our key maths vocabulary to describe the properties of 3D shapes, and drew out nets to match up with the different shapes we described.



In science, we had a Science on Stage workshop by the Royal Institution and Benjamin Franklin house. We watched some explosive experiments, and then conducted our own experiments using bottles of water to explore the pitch and volume of sound.



For our writing, we produced our own poems around the theme of 'hope', before performing them to the class.

Year 4 and 5 had a virtual author visit on Monday from Patience Agbabi, the author of *The Time Thief*. The children listened to her exciting presentation about the different characters in her book, what inspired those characters and the inspiration for her plot. The children then had the opportunity to ask questions including “What particular type of reader would you recommend your book to?” – Felix Elster

Ruby - “I loved the author visit, she taught us some really cool facts and at the end people asked her some really amazing questions.”

Deborah – “It was really fun especially when we learnt that in 1752, 11 days of the calendar were erased and that inspired part of her story.”




