Key Knowledge

When? Sunday 2 - September -Thursday 6 September 1666. Where? Pudding Lane. Why? A bakery, owned by Thomas Farriner, caught on lire.

How did it spread so quickly? The houses were made of wood and built too close together. It was very dry.

Who put the fire out? There were no firefighters so the people of London put it out.

How do we know about this? We can use sources like diaries and newspapers.




