## Key Vocabulary

<i>refugee</i>	<i>someone who has left their home and does not have a new home to go to</i>
<i>immigrant</i>	<i>a person who has come to live in a country from some other country.</i>
<i>settlement</i>	<i>a place where people have come to live and have built homes.</i>
<i>topography</i>	<i>the physical shape of an area, including its hills, valleys, and rivers.</i>
<i>physical feature</i>	<i>natural geographical features e.g. hills, lakes</i>
<i>human feature</i>	<i>human made landmarks e.g. houses, statues</i>
<i>immigration</i>	<i>the coming of people into a country in order to live and work there.</i>
<i>emigration</i>	<i>when you leave your own country to live in another country.</i>
