Healthy Schools Gold Award

We are delighted to announce that the school has been awarded the Healthy Schools Gold Award! We are really proud of this achievement, especially as we are one of only three schools in Lambeth to gain the award.

Over the past three years, St Jude's has been working incredibly hard to achieve the Healthy Schools Gold Award. This is an initiative started by the Mayor of London to get schools thinking about the physical and emotional health of their children.

To qualify for this award the school has done a variety of things to show our commitment to ensuring the physical and emotional health of our children. This has included:

- Taking part in various mental health days and weeks throughout the year
- Ensuring our weekly PSHE lessons promote and include discussions around how we can look after our physical and mental health
- Introducing Wellbeing Ambassadors in each key stage 2 class
- Introducing wellbeing corners in every classroom, giving children an area to self-regulate and manage their emotions
- Launching the ELSA programme which has been a huge success

The impact of these initiatives were measured by exploring the voice of the pupils in a range of ways. This included pupil surveys, conversations with children across the school and feedback from the Wellbeing Ambassadors. These results then supported us in achieving the Gold Award.

Looking after our physical health and emotional wellbeing is now part of the culture and ethos of St Jude's, and we plan to continue develop and grow this area of our school life.

Thank you to all the hard work of the children, staff and Wellbeing Ambassadors in helping towards this huge achievement.

What have Year 2 been up to?

Recently in Year 2 we have been inspired by our learning on the Great Fire of London. We had a drama workshop from 'Teach it through drama'; this helped us to learn more about the topic.











We created houses that look like the houses of the time. We know that in 1666 houses were built of wood and this meant they would have burnt down very quickly. We looked at different patterns on Tudor houses and designed our own before making them develop our acting skills too.

What have Year 2 been up to?

In English we have been looking at writing instructions for baking bread. First we baked the bread ourselves to make us experts and then we used different bossy verbs to help us write up the instructions and recipe. We can't wait to share it with our families to try over half term!







In Science we have been learning about the plant lifecycle. We explored what different seeds and bulbs looked like before planting our own. We have been checking to see what our plants look like each week and making observations and predictions about what will happen next.







We have also had our class assembly this week so we have been very busy! We want to see a big thank you to our grown-ups, for coming to see us tell you all about our learning so far in Year 2.

St Jude's Reading Party


