- Food – Be an entrepreneur and create your own recipe book

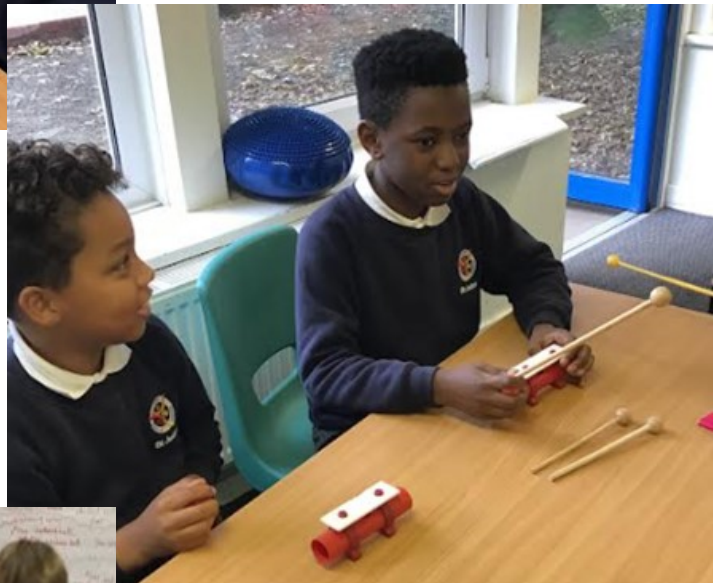
We are also looking out for original ideas too!
