For being so proactive in her learning by always making sure she has her reading books and spelling.




## What has Year 6 been up to?

In case we have not met, my name is Ms Fender. I am the SENDCo (Special Educational Needs and Disabilities Co-ordinator).

I had been off due to illness, but am back and excited to re-start my *SEND* Surgery. These sessions are open to any parent or carer who has concerns that their child may be struggling to learn as a result of illness, have an existing condition, anxiety or something else...

**Who?** Parents or Carers can meet with Ms Fender

**Why?** My working days are Monday's, Thursday's and Friday's, so I would like to offer a time solely dedicated to meeting with you about your concerns regarding your child's challenges to access the curriculum.

Where? You can choose to meet face-to-face or via telephone

When? First Friday of the month

Time? 10 minute slots between 09:30 and 12:30

**How?** Telephone the Office and request to book for SEND surgery. Bookings can be made on the week of the surgery.


