In maths we have started our new learning which is 'Length and Perimeter'. We took it in turns to measure each other, objects in the classroom and then the classroom itself.




What has Year 3 been up to?

In case we have not met, my name is Ms Fender. I am the SENDCo (Special Educational Needs and Disabilities Co-ordinator).

I had been off due to illness, but am back and excited to re-start my *SEND* Surgery. These sessions are open to any parent or carer who has concerns that their child may be struggling to learn as a result of illness, have an existing condition, anxiety or something else...

Who? Parents or Carers can meet with Ms Fender

Why? My working days are Monday's, Thursday's and Friday's, so I would like to offer a time solely dedicated to meeting with you about your concerns regarding your child's challenges to access the curriculum.

Where? You can choose to meet face-to-face or via telephone

When? First Friday of the month

Time? 10 minute slots between 09:30 and 12:30

How? Telephone the Office and request to book for SEND surgery. Bookings can be made on the week of the surgery.


