Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 were visited by author Rashmi Sirdeshpande.






Year 3 and Year 4 went to Station Hall in Herne Hill to meet Joseph Coelho.






St Jude's Reading Party

During the week, each class has completed a special lesson on 'connections'.


Below are pictures of Year 1 finding connection through gardening, sharing their ideas and creating their own fantasy garden.
