

English:

- Reading quality texts such as Charlie and the Chocolate Factory by Roald Dahl.
- Using subheading to organise our writing.
- Exploring non-fiction texts focussing on the history of chocolate.
- Identifying determiners, pronouns and adverbials.
- Drafting and rewriting work that creates settings, characters and plots.

PE Teamwork and Athletics:

- Jumping, running and throwing activities
- Manage short and long distance races

Computing:

- In computing this half term we will be data logging, including:
- answering questions,
 - data collecting
 - data analysing
 - data for answers

Art:

- Use a range of techniques involved in water colours including:
 - washes
 - bleeds
 - scratches
 - splashes

Humanities:

- Learning about the Mayans and where the cocoa bean originated from.
- Exploring features on OS maps using 6 figure grid references.
- Studying the different continents and their different climates.
- Understanding the connection between cocoa production and the equator.

Science – Sound

- Use and understand the meaning of scientific vocabulary such as vacuum, sound waves and particles.
- Investigate how we use our ears to hear sound.
- Discover how vibration creates sound and what happens if the vibration is greater.
