

## Why are they having a Jewish party?

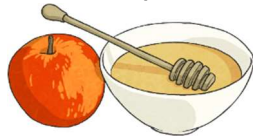
### Key Knowledge:

Rosh Hashanah - Jewish New Year.



It is celebrated in the autumn and a special horn, shofar, is blown to show the start of the new year.

Special food is eaten to celebrate such as apple and honey and challah bread. The sweet food is to help people think about the good things to come in the new year.



They are celebrating to help them remember!

Lots of Jewish celebrations are to remind people of stories from the Old Testament or Torah.

### Key Knowledge:

Sukkot - a time to remember how thousands of years ago the Jewish people wandered the desert, trying to find a place to live..

Jewish people build a Sukkah to celebrate. During Sukkot Jews spend as much time as possible here - praying, eating and celebrating with families.

### Key Vocabulary:

Rosh Hashanah - Jewish New Year.

Shofar - A special horn that is blown.

Sukkot - Jewish celebration to remember Jewish people in the desert.

Torah - Jewish holy book.

### Key knowledge: Sukkah



A sukkah must have at least three walls. These walls can be made out of anything. People often use wood, textiles, brick, metal or stone.



The roof of the sukkah must be something found from the ground, such as plants, grasses or branches.
