

Message from the Chair of Governors

Dear parents and carers,

It seems unreal how quickly this academic year is flying by! Easter is almost here – it is very exciting seeing the new growth and longer days that come with Springtime. St. Jude's as always, continues to be a hive of activity for both staff and children. I would like to take this opportunity to say a huge thank you to Miss Douch and all the staff for the superb job they are doing to ensure that our vision of Happy, Inspired and Loved children permeates the school. Ofsted, in their report said *"Leaders create a nurturing environment, where children are happy and safe. Pupils enjoy learning and are proud of their school"*

In the past few years, schools have faced unprecedented challenges, especially the impact of Covid, and real terms cuts to budgets. St. Jude's has not just faced these challenges head on but remarkably, in terms of academic outcomes for the children, achieved outstanding results at the end of last year – about 20% higher attainment across the board than the national and borough average.

The only constant in life seems to be change! As you know, all London schools are being impacted by demographic change resulting in significant falls in pupil numbers in all boroughs. Lambeth and Southwark have been particularly affected and I want to assure you that our governing board is working very closely with the Diocese and the local authority to develop a sustainable strategy to ensure that St. Jude's continues to thrive.

As we work through this process, we are incredibly grateful to Miss Douch as acting headteacher and to Mr Rojas who continues to support as consultant headteacher this academic year. We will of course keep you informed of longer term plans as they develop.

In the meanwhile, I would like to wish you all a wonderful Easter holiday with your children.




