

English:

In our lessons we will be:

- Reading quality texts, such as *The Boy in the Tower*
- Learning to select vocabulary for its effect on our reader
- Learning to use the full range of punctuation taught at Key Stage, including colons and semi-colons to separate independent clauses

Computing:

In computing we will:

- Create a program to run on a controllable device
- Explain that selection can control the flow of a program
- Develop a program to use inputs and outputs on a controllable device

Art & Design Technology:

- We will be creating props to support with the production and designing tickets and programmes to distribute to the school
- As part of design technology, we will also be looking at monitoring and controls in electrical designs

PE:

- In outdoor PE, we will be practising athletic skills ready for Sports Day.
- We will be developing our skills in cricket with a cricket coach



Humanities:

In our lessons we will be:

- Exploring the physical geography of a South American country, Colombia, and comparing it to the UK
- Using the language of biomes and climate zones to analyse how climate change might impact a country
- Exploring the human geography of trade links and distribution of resources

Science:

This half term we will be looking at light and exploring how changing the position or distance of a light source can impact the size of a shadow. We will learn about the way that light travels.

Year 6 Summer 2 Our Wonderful World

This half term the children will be going on a trip to the Velodrome and having a coach to support them with cricket for PE.

Maths:

In our maths lessons we will be revising key learning from Year 6 to ensure we are ready for secondary school! We will also be applying our knowledge and skills in a range of hands on problem solving activities to allow us to think about our maths in different ways.

Music:

- We will continue with our steel pan lessons
- We will be rehearsing our songs for our production and leavers' assembly.
