In maths we have been learning about matching. We have been matching the different pictures from Goldilocks and the 3 bears to help us see what is the same and different.


















We are very excited to be celebrating Black History Month this October. As part of our celebrations, we will have a multi-cultural day on **Tuesday 31st October**.











Local Events and Clubs
