This half term reception have been learning about Hanukkah. We have been learning about the celebration, reading stories linked to Hanukkah and made our own menorahs. We think they look great!







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

Eagerly discussing the surrounding landmarks, the students marvelled at St. Paul's Cathedral, learning that its dome is one of the largest in the world. Crossing the Millennium Bridge, they discovered its fascinating wobbling effect, earning it the affectionate nickname "the wobbly bridge."

Continuing their journey, the group passed by the historic Globe Theatre, where they delved into the world of Shakespearean plays and the vibrant history of the iconic theatre. Turning back along South Bank towards the National Theatre, the students soaked in the breath-taking cityscape, capturing images that would later inspire their art lesson, shown above.

At the National Theatre, the cold November weather was forgotten as the students enjoyed a hearty lunch, reenergizing for the rest of their day. The theatre, with its distinctive modern architecture, became a haven for both warmth and artistic inspiration.

The adventure pressed on as the students ventured towards the London Eye, discovering fun facts about its engineering marvel and panoramic views. Walking along the Golden Jubilee Bridge, they amazed at the sight of Westminster and Big Ben, learning that the Elizabeth Tower's famous clock chimes were temporarily silenced during World War I.








Year 3 Trip to London Southbank
