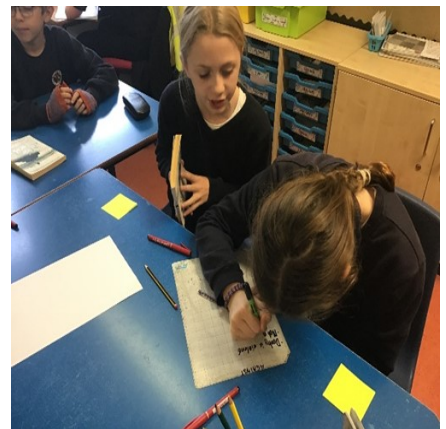

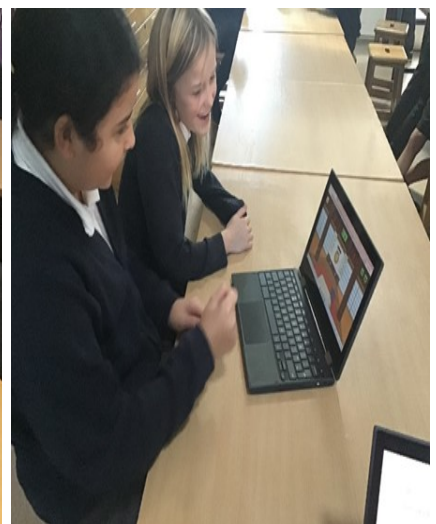
What has Class 5/6 been up to?

'English Flood'.

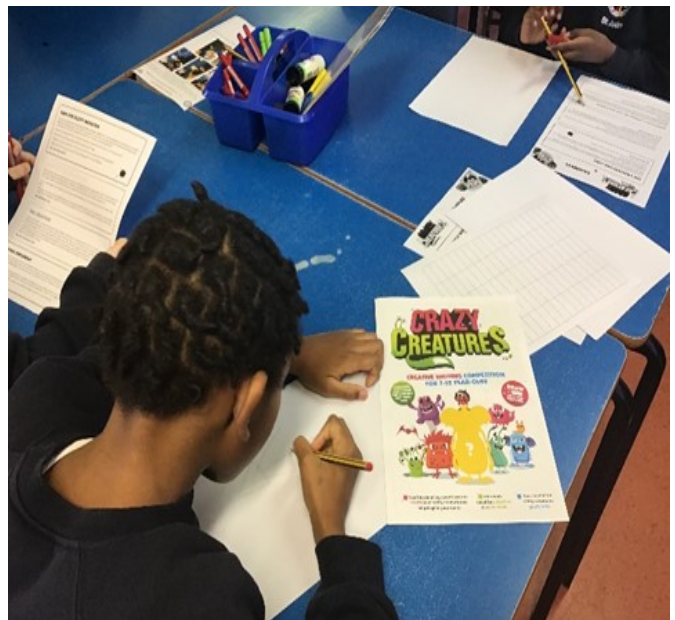
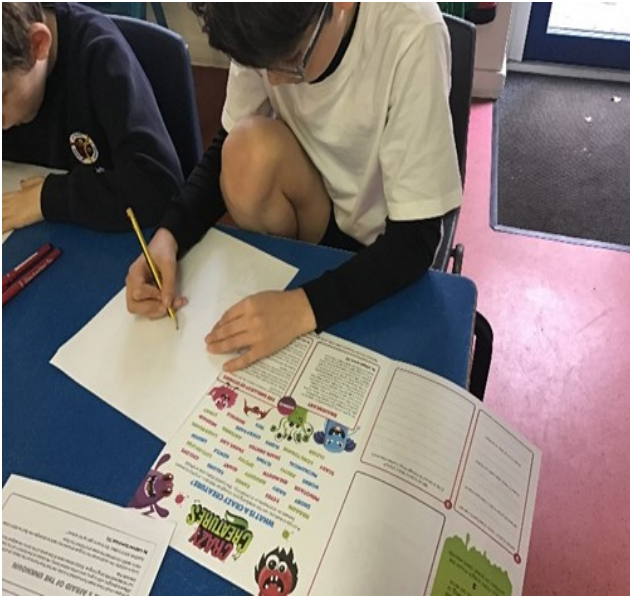


In Maths, we've continued with our learning about Fractions, this time focusing on multiplying fractions! We also revised our multiplication and division skills on the Chromebooks!
