We really enjoyed Class 3's assembly this week, teaching us about how to look after our wonderful world!






Maths Masterclasses

Our session took place at Trinity Academy in one of their science laboratories!















Wellbeing Ambassador Conference

During the morning, there will be a designated area for parents and carers to watch their children take part in all the events. Please stay in this area so that the events can be managed easily by the staff. It is also essential that the children stay with the school staff at all times. Please refrain from taking your child away from their class and school staff (including to go to the toilet).

Please ensure that your child is dressed in their PE kit for the day, has a bottle of water and sun cream applied (the weather is forecast to be warm and sunny!)

Safeguarding

We have secure safeguarding measures in place to ensure that every one is kept safe in school.

We ask that all adults, who are not school staff, do not enter the classrooms if a member of staff is not present. This includes at drop off and pick up. Please wait in the playground and a member of staff will speak to you when/if they are available.

Uniform and Lost Property

All school uniform should be clearly labelled with your child's name. If your child removes their uniform (mainly school jumpers), we ask them to put it in the their bags or trays so they can find it easily.


Class 2

Class Four/Five's Friday Star is Suriah. Suriah shows such commitment to her learning, not just this week but always. This




Class 1

Class Three's Friday Star is Esaie! Esaie has worked really hard during English this week. He has been showing his wonderful imagination and writing ability with a wonderful piece about






Class 5/6


