


Friday Stars!

Well done JJ!




Class 4

Attendance

It is essential that our children are in school as much as possible—every school day counts!

If your child is not well enough to attend school, please let the school know by 9am on the day. This can be done by calling the school or sending an email to admin@stjudeslambeth.org. If we do not hear from you, we will contact you directly.

If you need to take your child out of school during term time for any other reason, please notify the school as soon as possible. You will need to provide fill in a **Request for Pupil Absence Form** which can be obtained from the school office. The Head of School will then make a decision if this absence can be authorised or not.

If your child has a medical appointment, we encourage families to make the appointment for out of school hours. If this is not possible, the school must be notified with proof of the appointment so that the absence can be authorised.
